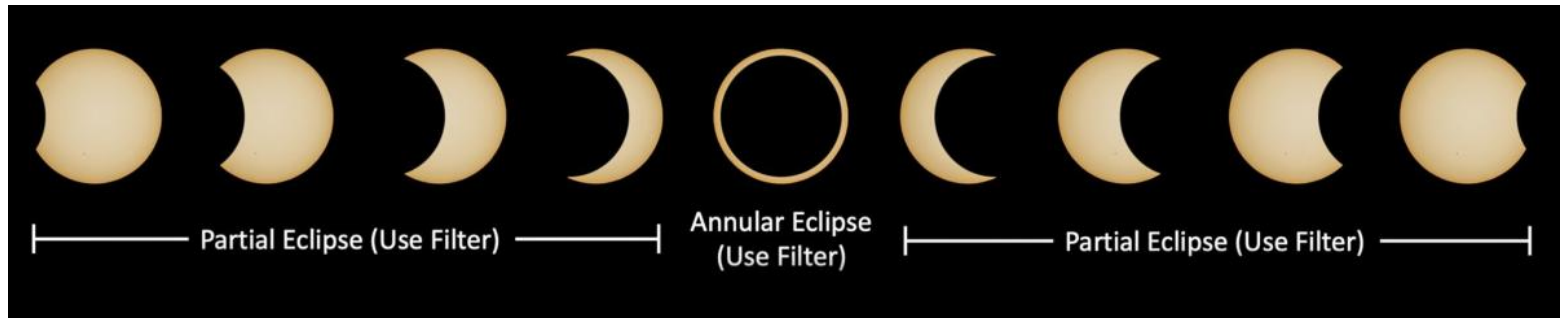


Be prepared for the Annular Eclipse 2023

The upcoming annular eclipse on October 14 promises to be a captivating spectacle for residents of Klamath County and nearby regions. The peak of the eclipse will be 9:15am on Saturday morning and will last for approximately 4 minutes. Remember not to look directly at the sun without using the specially designed glasses for solar eclipse. Although the annular eclipse will bring an economic boost to Chiloquin and Klamath County, this will also bring extra traffic to our area along with higher demands on cell towers as well as potentially longer lines and wait times.

Be Prepared:

- Make sure your vehicles are filled up early in the week of October 14.
- Stock up on medications, food, water, and other essentials.
- Plan for any doctor visits prior to or after the week of October 14.
- Be prepared to pay with cash that weekend as credit card and debit card purchases may be slowed down due to high cell tower and Internet usage.
- Be prepared for high traffic on certain roads and highways, in particular Highways 97 and 62.
